2.5.3 Can Sask Job Grant presentation – Brent Zlukosky

Brent Zlukosky Client Services Consultant, Government of Saskatchewan gave a presentation on the Can Sask Job Grant. The following questions were asked that he could not provide definite answers to were:

- 1.) Why do we need the SIN number on the Trainee forms?
- 2.) Can those employed outside of Saskatchewan with a Saskatchewan company be eligible for the job grant?
- 3.) If some safety tickets (ex. Standard First Aid/CPR) have expired, can this be considered new training and be eligible for Can Sask Job Grant.

Brent has replied to these questions and the answers are as follows:

1. We need SIN number to get credit from the Feds when we do our cost claim and for follow up to determine the effectiveness of the program. You can reassure trainees that their information is protected by privacy laws.
2. They do not have to be Saskatchewan residents but the job does have to be located in Saskatchewan. An employer could choose someone who currently resides in Ontario to

train if they were going to be subsequently employed in the province. If the employer has work that takes individuals to other locations on a project basis, they can also train for these positions as long as the employee is based in Saskatchewan and thus has a "Saskatchewan Job".

3. If the training is a requirement to perform in the position and has traditionally been paid for by the employee or employer it would not be considered incremental therefore would not be eligible for the job grant.



- How will they control hazards?
- Are there kids, pets, or other items to consider?
- How will they secure the site after hours?
